Membership

During the current year (2021) the present membership of AFST(I) stands at 4118 of which 3886 are life members.

Credential Committee: The Credential committee met Five times during the year to scrutinize the applications received. Because of the extended life membership offer, there was a remarkable increase in the number of life membership applications this year also, and the Credential committee did a wonderful job in expediting the clearance of the application forms.

<u>Life membership drive</u>: Based on the request from members, a Life Membership drive during the current year was also launched. The drive was launched at DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru by President Designate Dr. Alok K Srivastava in the presence of HQ Members of CEC. In the first instance, the promotional life membership offer was made available from 23rd April to 31st July 2021 and later again from 1st September to 31st October 2021. The information about the membership drive was hosted on the AFST(I) website for wider dissemination of the information.

Finance committee: The salient recommendations made by the committee are as follows :

- The financial support to Hyderabad, Aurangabad, Thrissur, Mumbai, and NIFTEM Chapters for organizing World Food Day/Nutritional Week based on their request.
- Renewal of 12A registration to 12 AB.
- Renewal of 80G

Website committee: Portal for chapters online election was made under one organization one website initiative. The Application Software (MIS) is in the final stage of development and will be implemented shortly.

Building committee: The team of AFST(I) visited the Chairman, MUDA and requested him to allot an alternative suitable site to AFST(I) as the one allotted to AFST(I) was re-allotted to another person. Activities in this direction to get the site allotted to AFST(I) are in progress.

With the permission of the CEC the interiors and the woodwork for the renovated office building were carried out.

Bye-law amendment committee: As per the suggestion of the bye-law amendment committee, a format was prepared and sent to all the life members and chapters for getting their valuable inputs. The inputs received from the members were deliberated by the committee for its recommendation.

ISO 9001 CERTIFICATION & IMPLEMENTATION: The CEC felt the need to get ISO accreditation for AFST(I) HQ. A committee was constituted for the purpose. The following are activities suggested by the committee to include in SOP;

- 1) For AFST(I) office Personnel what are their role, qualification, expected performance
- 2) Election of office bearers how to carryout
- 3) Conference committees the role of chair and Co-Chair, etc.
- 4) Membership categories
- 5) Management of journals
- 6) Liaisoning with chapters

Awards Committee: The awards committee met several times to scrutinize and evaluate the applications/ nominations received for various awards of AFST(I) as per the awards guidelines. The awards committee submitted its recommendations for various awards to the Central Executive Committee.

Technical Committee: It was decided to have a panel of experts take up the responsibility of giving inputs to various Regulatory Bodies on behalf of the AFST(I). A format was prepared to invite the expression of interest from members for the empanelment of the experts from AFST(I). Members' expression of interest has been consolidated and is now ready for further deliberation, finalization, and recommendation.

Government Relations Committee: The committee deliberated on sending a recommendation to the Government agencies for the inclusion of Food Science / Food Technology in their fellowship exams. It was suggested that Head of Institutions of various institutions like CFTRI, IICT, NIFTEM, IIFPT need to write in this regard so that the request will not be ignored when it is sent from multiple sources. A similar request should go from AFST(I). It was suggested that top bureaucrats/policymakers should be invited to various AFST(I) events to familiarize and apprise them about the AFST(I) activities directly.

Staff appointment committee: The committee scrutinized the applications received for the vacant post of AFST(I). Ms. Suvarna was appointed to the position of Lower Division Assistant w.e.f. 24th November 2021.

Mr Shankarappa B Jakkali has been redesignated as Office Superintendent from 1st April 2021.

Students Committee: The Students Committee put in considerable efforts on following initiatives.

- 1. Identification of 3 to 5 days Training Programs for Students to be organized by AFST(I) annually
- 2. Recommendation to the agencies granting fellowships to research students for inclusion of Food Science / Food Technology in their fellowship exams.
- 3. Common entrance exam for all the Food Technologists at National Level.

- 4. Award of AFST(I) scholarship to meritorious student at 1st year and 2nd year of their PG program in the Food Science and Technology, Food Technology, Food Engineering etc. at each AFST (I) chapter level all across the country.
- 5. AFST(I) award for Best PhD thesis in various disciplines of Food Science and Technology
- 6. Proposal for inclusion of Food Technology as a subject for various exams conducted by UPSC and state level exams.

It was also felt that an active participation of various chapters could make these proposals actionable at wider horizon and larger number of participation from students' fraternity.

During 28th ICFoST, three online competitions (for UG, PG and Research Scholars) were organized by the students' committee. While for UG, it was PICK AND SPEAK; organized presentations were made by PG and Research Scholars.

II. *E- Election:* Shri B Vasu was nominated as the Returning Officer for the current year's elections of AFST(I) based on his experience of conducting the online elections. The results of the election will be announced officially in the AGBM as per the notice of the AGBM.

III. Annual Convention and other activities at Headquarters:

Online Quiz competition: An online quiz competition was organized for the UG, PG, and research scholars on the occasion of the **World Food Safety Day 2021** on 18th June 2021 in virtual mode. Certificates and mementos have been issued to Winners and Participation Certificate to all the participants. There were about 130 participants.

The organisation of 28th Indian Convention of Food Scientists and Technologists (ICFoST):

1. The Logo and the Theme of the 28th ICFoST

The Logo and Theme contest was organised for Students and PhD Research Fellows, both for members as well as non-members. The response was very good, and the expert team scrutinised the entries and selected a logo and the theme for adoption with the required modification.

2. Curtain Raiser and Memorial Lectures :

The CEC decided to organise the 28th Indian Convention of Food Scientists and Technologists [ICFoST] at Aurangabad, from 20th to 22nd January 2022 on the theme "Emerging and Adoptable Technologies for Sustainable Agro-Food industries and Economy (EAT-SAFE)" in association with AFST(I) Mumbai and Aurangabad Chapters with the CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru, DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru, and ICT, Mumbai as Co-Organisers.

The first Curtain Raiser of the 28th ICFoST was organised at Headquarters on 27th August 2021 at IFTTC Auditorium of CSIR-CFTRI along with the Dr H A B Parpia Memorial Lecture and Shri G C P Rangarao Memorial Lecture in a hybrid mode. The program was organised in association with CSIR-CFTRI and DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru. Dr Sridevi Annapurna Singh, Director, CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru delivered the Dr H A B Parpia Memorial Lecture and Dr R Kumar, Associate Director, DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru delivered the Shri. G C P Rangarao Memorial lecture.

As part of the curtain-raiser for the 28th ICFoST, Dr. Sridevi Annapurna Singh and Dr R Kumar unveiled the logo of the Convention and also released the first circular of the Convention. In their remarks, Dr. Sridevi Annapurna Singh and Dr R Kumar, appreciated the work done by the AFST(I) and wished the Convention to be a grand success.

A large number of food scientists and technologists participated in the program through virtual mode.

The Curtain Raisers of the 28th ICFOST were also organised by the Hyderabad, Bangalore, Mumbai, and Aurangabad Chapters of AFST(I) to promote the 28th ICFoST among various stakeholders.

3. 28th ICFoST

In view of the COVID 19 pandemic, it was decided to hold the 28th ICFoST in Virtual mode. The conference was coordinated from the ICT, Jalna campus by the AFST(I) HQ, Mysuru, AFST(I) Aurangabad Chapter, and AFST(I) Mumbai Chapter.

The Conference was virtually inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Dr. Bhagwatji Karad, Hon'ble Minister of State, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, New Delhi, on 20th January 2022. The Guests of Honour of the inaugural function were Prof (Dr) Aniruddha Pandit, Vice Chancellor, ICT, Mumbai, Dr Sridevi Annapurna Singh, Director, CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru, Dr Anil Dutt Semwal, Director, DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru and Prof (Dr)Pramod Yeole, Vice Chancellor, Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. Announcement of annual awards was also part of the inaugural function

There were three convention talks by Prof (Dr) Aniruddha Pandit, Vice Chancellor, ICT, Mumbai, Dr Sridevi Annapurna Singh, Director, CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru, and Dr R. Kumar, Associate Director, DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru. The Amla Memorial Lecture was delivered by Dr. Prema Ramachandran, Director, Nutrition Foundation of India, New Delhi.

More than 400 delegates participated in the conference virtually. The conference had 33 technical sessions spread over Three days on various sub-themes. There were Nine plenary talks delivered by eminent experts, Seventy Six experts in the field delivered invited talks on various sub-themes. Eight oral talks and Twenty Six Oral Presentations (Poster to Oral) were made during the conference. A virtual poster session was organised which attracted 234 E-poster presentations. The technical sessions included special sessions on 'Start Up Conclave', 'Smart Protein' and 'Student Event'. The 'Student Event' is a new feature added to the ICFoST where competition were organised for UG, PG and Ph.D. students. A virtual Expo component was also included in the conference which attracted about 26 exhibitors. The winner of the 28th ICFoST logo contest was honoured during the event.

The valedictory function, concluding the conference was hel virtually on January 22, 2022. Dr Ashok Dhawan, Vice-chancellor of Vasantrao Naik Marathwada Krishi Vidyapeeth participated in the function as the Chief Guest and gave his remarks. The 28th ICFoST awards were announced in the Valedictory function. The awards were conferred on researchers and students in oral presentation category, poster category, and student event category. The best exhibitor awards were conferred on Three exhibitors who participated in the virtual EXPO.

The organisation of the ICFoST in online mode on a virtual platform was a first for the AFST(I).

IV. Publications

Journal of Food Science & Technology: The Journal is in its 58th volume and 12th year of going online. We are pleased to inform you that there is an increase in the journal's impact factor to 2.701. The CEC places on record its commendation to Editor-in-Chief Dr N Bhaskar and his committed team for their meticulous efforts.

Indian Food Industry Mag: This journal was formerly known as INDIAN FOOD INDUSTRY (1982-2018), Volume 1 to Volume 37 and currently known as INDIAN FOOD INDUSTRY Mag (2019 – current) i.e., Volume 3. The conscientious efforts of Dr P S Negi the Chief Editor, and his wonderful team is praiseworthy. The Chief Editor issued certificates to all the reviewers, and the list of the reviewers was published in the last issue of IFI Mag 2021.

V. *New Chapter/s:* The Aurangabad chapter got approval during the year. It is gratifying to note they were ready to shoulder the responsibility of organising the 28th ICFoST immediately after forming the Chapter. There were requests from Coimbatore and Agartala also for opening new chapters. Necessary information has been sent to facilitate the formation of the Chapters.

VI. *Chapters:* Chapters are wings of AFST(I) for dissemination of knowledge on Food Science & Technology. Continuous efforts were made to get the audited accounts and a brief of their activities.

Chapter Activities: The reports on the activities were received only from Fourteen Chapters, *viz.*, Allahabad, Aurangabad, Bengaluru, Chennai, Cochin, Davangere, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Kakinada, Kollum, Mumbai, Nagpur, Pune and Thrissur. A brief on the reports received from these Chapters is given below.

ALLAHABAD CHAPTER: The Allahabad chapter and Centre of Food Technology celebrated National Nutrition Month **"Poshan Maah" – 2021**" from September 1-30, 2021. Based on the current year's theme for National Nutrition Week **"Local for Poshan- from Womb to Elderly**" emphasizing the significance of correct and adequate nutrition for every age group, the following online competitions were being organised jointly by AFST(I) Allahabad Chapter and Centre of Food Technology:

- (a) Feeding Smart Right from the Start" -Poster Competition
- (b) # Hashtag—Good Food Good Health...!"- Meme Contest.
- (c) Weaning the way to Child- Health"- Selfie with Weaning Recipe Contest.

Students of B.Voc. Food Processing and Technology, M.Sc. Nutritional Sciences and M.Sc. Food Technology, Centre of Food Technology, University of Allahabad & B.Sc. Food Nutrition and Dietetics and M.Sc. Food Science and Nutrition of Department of Food Nutrition and Public Health, SHUATS, Prayagraj participated in the events. The event was organised by Dr. Uravshi Sharma, LEC member and Dr. Pinki Saini, Secretary, AFST(I) Allahabad Chapter.

AURANGABAD CHAPTER: The UDCT, Dr. BAMU, Aurangabad with the support of AFSTI Aurangabad Chapter, Stakeholders, and Local Food Technology colleges/institutes (MIT, MGM, IIFST, etc.) celebrated World Food Day on October 16, 2021, at Conference Hall of UDCT, Aurangabad (Maharashtra) in hybrid mode. The event was attended by 65 participants through offline mode and more than 300 participants through online mode from various reputed Institutes of Maharashtra and other states as well. Based on the theme"Our actions are our future. Better production, Better nutrition, Better environment, and a better life", essay competition and quiz competition were arranged and prizes were distributed to the winners. Dr B.K. Sakhale felicitated the guests and briefed them about the event in his welcome speech. In the plenary session, Rahul Barhate, CEO of GoFrutto Fruit Exports LLP, Pune spoke about opportunities in fruit and vegetable exports. Expert speakers guided the participants on nutritious diet, purity and safety methods. The visitors got information about food safety and a healthy diet. The 2nd LEC meeting of AFST(I) Aurangabad Chapter was held on 18.11.2021 at 1.00 pm at Hotel Welcome Rama International, Aurangabad. The meeting was presided over by Prof Dr Bhagwan Sakhale, President

AFST(I) Aurangabad Chapter. The Meeting chairman was Mr Fulchand Jain. Mr Uday Naik, the Secretary, welcomed the members and briefed about the agenda of the meeting. A two-minute silence was observed in the memory of deceased Smt Sumanbai Chandrakant Ingalwar Jain, mother of Shri Fulchand Jain, and prayed to the Almighty to grant peace to the departed soul. Prof Dr Bhagwan Sakhale briefed about ICFoST scheduled to be held during 20th – 22nd January 2022 at Aurangabad. AFST(I) Aurangabad Chapter is co-host of ICFoST-2021 and Prof BhagwanSakhale is Local Organizing Secretary. The brochure of the conference was unveiled and roles and responsibilities of various committee members were discussed in detail. Hotel Welcome Rama International will be the venue for ICFoST 2021. There was discussion about sponsorships, expo, souvenir, hall arrangements, catering, logistics etc. Mr S.B. Kulkarni, Treasurer presented the financial statement. A new temporary bank account in the name of 28th ICFoST is opened at State Bank of India (SBI), Shahnurwadi Branch, Aurangabad for the transactions of upcoming conference.
